The Center for Latin American Monetary Studies (CEMLA) is pleased to organize the first version of the Latin American Journal of Central Banking (LAJCB) Conference, to be held on July 6 - 7, 2023. CEMLA invites paper contributions broadly covering topics of interest to central banks, including but not limited to monetary theory and policy, finance, financial stability, climate change concerning financial systems, financial market infrastructures and technologies. The conference is open to papers that may or may not wish to be published in the LAJCB.

Papers accepted for presentation will be discussed by another speaker within the same session. Accepted papers, presentations, and discussions will be posted on the Conference website to facilitate the discussion among participants.
